The legal basis for collecting the following data is Sect. 24 in conjunction with Sect. 3 of the Registration Act dated 3 May 2013 (Federal Law Gazette 2013, part 1, p. 1084 et seq. as revised at the time. Any violation is on pain of a fine (Registration Act, sect. 54 [2]).

Please read these important instructions before filling in this de-registration form!

1. You only need to de-register, if you do not move to another dwelling in Germany. In that case, you need to submit the de-registration form within two weeks following the move to the Residents' Registration Bureau. At the same time, you need to present a valid identity document to the Residents' Registration Bureau.

A separate form has to be used for each person being de-registered. Members of the same family may be de-registered on a joint de-registration form.

2. The de-registration form must be clearly and legibly filled in, **accurately** and **in full**. If a question does not need to be answered, or if an answer does not apply, please enter a dash.
3. If you are not yet able to specify your future address, to indicate your whereabouts, it is sufficient that you specify your employer, relatives, friends or business partners where you can be reached by mail before you officially register your new address. You must also specify any of your future addresses abroad.
4. You need to specify your main place of abode or any of your secondary places of residence only, if one of the persons de-registering has one or several dwellings on German territory at the same time. Each time you de-register, you have to state which further dwellings you have on German territory, and which one is your **main place of abode**. If you move out from a secondary place of residence without having moved into a new dwelling on German territory, you are required to inform the Residents' Registration Bureau of the community which is in charge of your sole place of residence or your main place of abode.
5. If you hold citizenship in more than one country, you must list all of them.

Further important note

If you have more than one dwelling in future, please note that any change in the main place of abode has to be reported in writing to the Residents' Registration Bureau of your new main place of abode, within two weeks.
